#### **Program designed to:**

- Respond to changing landscape of ECE in British Columbia (need for certified early childhood educators across BC).
- Prepare students to work as early childhood educators in ECE settings (e.g., preschools, child care, StrongStart centres, and other ECE-related professions).
- Meet all requirements for certification by the BC ECE Registry in the Ministry of Children and Family Development (students apply to the BC ECE Registry for an ECE Assistant and/or Basic ECE Basic Certificate).

#### **GENERAL OVERVIEW AND PURPOSE OF PROGRAM**



- The BC ECE certificates are specific to practicing in the province of British Columbia.
- All ECED courses leading to the certificates are offered online and follow UBC calendar dates.

- Upon completion of ONE of the following courses:
  - ❖ ECED 401: Supporting Young Children's Health and Well-Being in Early Childhood Settings
  - ❖ ECED 407: Supporting Early Learning in the Preschool Years
  - ❖ EPSE 406: Typical and Atypical Development in Infants and Children
- Students apply to the BC ECE Registry for an ECE Assistant Certificate.

- An individual with the ECE Assistant Certificate is able to work in an early childhood setting under the supervision of a certified early childhood educator.
- This allows students to work in early childhood settings while continuing to complete the BC ECE Basic Certificate.





- All courses in the program have been approved by the BC ECE Registry and must be completed in order to apply for an ECE Basic Certificate.
- Upon completion of all courses in the BC ECE certificate program students apply to the BC ECE Registry for an ECE Basic Certificate:



Unclassified / Certificate	\$176.45	\$1,270.37	

- Tuition for courses applied towards a certificate is charged on a per-credit basis. A standard 3 credit course would be  $$176.45 \times 3 = $529.35 + taxes$ , plus applicable student fees.
- UBC reserves the right to raise fees, usually once a year: about 2% for domestic students, and between 2% 5% for continuing international students.

#### **TUITION & FEES**



#### **Student Fees**

- Student fees are charged in addition to tuition, and vary from term to term, with some opt-out provisions. Details about student fees are found in the UBC Calendar:

- Budget approximately **\$400 per year**, plus the following optional benefits:
- Medical/Dental Plan approximately \$232.49/year (charged in September only), with opt-out provision available.
- Compass Card (previously UPass) opt-out available
  - Applies to those who live in the Greater Vancouver Area
  - Allows you to travel in 3-zones on public transit
  - Cost: \$164.00/term
  - Fee exemptions possible for those that live out of the Greater Vancouver Area or out-of-province or outside the country.

Module 6: Child Study Movement

#### **Learning Objectives**

- To learn about the origins and influences of the Child Study Movement on the field of ECE.
- To critically engage with the question of translating scientific knowledge into ECE practice.

## Early Childhood Education and the Field of Psychology



Strong and lasting relations have formed between the field of ECE and the emerging field of psychology (in particularly developmental psychology) at the turn of the 20th century. Although the notion of a child's progressive development existed before the 20th century, as Rousseau, Pestalozzi, and Froebel proposed theories about child development, it was the scientific, standardized and systematic recording of infant and child's behavior that gave the developmental theory its mandate in the early 1900s.

The Child Study Movement changed the way we understand and view children. As well, the relationships that formed between the scientific study of the child and early education have had significant impact on the construction of the early childhood curriculum. Parents and teachers today are so familiar the phrase "age appropriate practice" (e.g., the idea that children develop through predictable age-related stages and that education must be formulated in response to these stages), that it is difficult to imagine a time that early education was not discussed in these terms.
