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Part-Time Teaching Position: Sessional Lecturer

Position Description

The Early Childhood Education program in the UBC Faculty of Education is looking for a sessional lecturer to teach one or more sections of the below noted **online** course:

Term: 2024 Summer Session (May 13 – August 9, 2024)
Course: EPSE 406 | Typical and Atypical Development in Infants and Children (1.5 credits)

Duties include, but are not limited to, teaching (including ongoing communication with students through discussion boards and weekly assignments), assessing and evaluating course assignments, and reporting grades.

Qualifications

Applicants <u>must</u> have a minimum of a recognized master's degree, with relevant professional experience working in early childhood education settings and academic expertise in course areas as required. Post-candidacy PhD students are encouraged to apply. Experience teaching in an online environment is preferred.

Prior experience working with Deaf or Hard of Hearing learners is preferred.
